



America's sweetheart Julia Roberts, 57, wife of cinematographer Daniel Moder and mother of 21-year-old twins as well as an 18-year-old son, can still find time to make a movie or two. In July 2024, she began shooting the thriller "After the Hunt" with Ayo Edebri, Andrew Garfield and Chloe Sevigny. Roberts plays a college professor grappling with her past amidst another professor's scandal. It opens on Oct. 10.

Her second film, also a thriller called *"Panic Carefully,"* is with Eddie Redmayne, Elizabeth Olsen, Brian Tyree Henry, and Ben Chaplin. It began shooting in January but is still waiting on a release date.



Leonardo DiCaprio and Martin Scorsese's "Killers of the Flower Moon" looked like a box-office disappointment (\$158.8 million gross after a \$215 million cost), but it scored big from on-demand sales with fans preferring to see it at home instead of in theaters. It received 10 Oscar nominations, including Best Picture, Best Actress (Lily Gladstone), and Best Supporting Actor (Robert De Niro).

DiCaprio's next film is the action thriller "One Battle After Another" with Sean Penn, Benicio del Toro, and Regina Hall. It's about revolutionaries who reunite to rescue one

of their own daughters from their evil enemy. After it was completed in June 2024, they had multiple test screenings, and as a result, director Paul Thomas Anderson cut 8-10 minutes based on feedback from audiences. Now its ready for release on Sept. 26!

The film had a \$140 million budget and will need to gross \$300 million to turn a profit. But if anyone can pull audiences in, DiCaprio can!



Tom Cruise's "Mission: Impossible -- The Final Reckoning" was a disappointing finish for his "Mission: Impossible" franchise, with only \$592 million grosses after a \$400 million cost. The most successful film of the franchise was the fifth installment, "Mission: Impossible -- Rogue Nation" (2015), which cost \$150 million and grossed \$710.9 million.

With "Mission" now completed, Cruise's new mission is starring in four-time Oscar-winning director Alejandro Gonzalez Inarritu's black comedy, which is tentatively titled "Judy." It was shot from November 2024 up to this past April and co-stars Jesse Plemons, Riz Ahmed and John Goodman. It hits theaters sometime in October 2026.



Here's a Tip

If you have lost a zipper pull, you can create a temporary one with a paperclip.

You can use a salad spinner to gently "wring out" delicate hand washables. Remove excess water, and then hang dry or lay flat according to the garment's instruction.

Here's an oldie but a goodie! Iced coffee is at its best when brewed with twice the usual amount of ground coffee, because the coffee is diluted by the (melting) ice cubes. Or use regular-strength brewed ice coffee and serve over coffee ice cubes. They're easy to prepare: Pour cool brewed coffee into ice-cube trays and freeze.

Clear bins make it easy to group like items in your pantry. You can remove the bin, get what you need and replace it rather than digging through cans and boxes on a shelf and having to straighten it back up when you're done.

Use rubbing alcohol to clean window frames and trays. It evaporates quickly with no residue left behind.

Metformin Can Help All People, Not Just Diabetics, Lose Weight

DEAR DR. ROACH: I am a 75-year-old woman who isn't prediabetic or diabetic. My BMI is 31.2. My doctor has prescribed a trial of metformin for weight loss as an alternative to starting Ozempic or one of the other weight-loss drugs. I have lost three pounds in a month, which is a start; exercise and healthier eating is also encouraged.

What are your thoughts on this new weight-loss tool and its possible long-term success? -- J.H.

ANSWER: Metformin, a treatment for diabetes that works mostly by preventing the liver from making sugar, isn't new and has been used to help people lose weight for at least 20 years. While it was first shown to help people with prediabetes or diabetes, it is also effective at helping people with normal blood sugar lose weight. However, the effectiveness is modest, with most people losing around 2-3 kilograms (about 5 pounds), which is stable as long as people continue taking the medicine.

I certainly agree with the changes in lifestyle. In studies, people who adhere to a healthier diet and exercise are likely to lose more weight than people who take metformin without lifestyle changes.

I've had occasional patients who get motivated by the success of metformin, making it easier for them to comply with the diet and exercise changes. I've also had people say that the weight they lose with metformin makes it easier to exercise. Metformin is moderately successful in preventing diabetes, but it is not as effective for weight loss as approved weight-loss medicines such as semaglutide (Ozempic).

Some of my patients have read about metformin as an anti-aging drug based on animal data, and there are studies ongoing to see whether this is true in humans. I do not recommend its use for this purpose outside of a clinical trial.

Gluten and celiac disease: untangling the truth

In recent years, supermarkets and specialty grocery stores have filled their shelves with gluten-free products such as breads, cereals and beers. It has caused many people to believe, often mistakenly, that gluten is harmful to their health. They turn to these products in their efforts to adopt better eating habits. What's the reality about gluten? Find out more.

Gluten is a protein primarily found in certain grains, such as wheat. It gives baked goods their soft texture and acts as a binding agent in various processed foods, including sauces, soups and deli meats. You can even find gluten in some cosmetic products. Essentially, gluten can be found just about everywhere.

Celiac disease, commonly referred to as gluten intolerance, celiac disease is an autoimmune disorder. It triggers an inflammatory reaction in the intestine when a person with the condition consumes gluten. Symptoms often include digestive issues like diarrhea, gas and nausea, but can also manifest as fatigue, headaches and joint pain. This condition affects an estimated one in 133 Americans.

In short, gluten is completely safe for individuals who don't have celiac disease, a wheat allergy or other gluten-related disorders. If you tolerate gluten well, there's no need to eliminate it from your diet.

VETERAN'S POST by Freddy Groves

When the punishment isn't enough

It's most disturbing when one in a position of authority, someone tasked with the specific job of helping veterans, turns out to be a thief. This is what came to light recently when a Veterans Service Representative (VSR) pleaded guilty to stealing money from the very veterans he was supposed to help.

The scammer broke a federal law when he solicited and accepted gratuities for helping veterans prepare their claims for retroactive disability benefits. He had his hand out for between 10 and 20% of each veteran's benefits after their claims were approved — while he was employed by the VA.

He's scheduled to be sentenced later this year and could get five years in prison, as well as a hefty fine.

Then we have the scammer nailed for identity theft and stalking. By stealing personal information, he was able to stalk victims online and in person, do transactions at their banks, change the routing information for their direct deposits, impersonate them at banks and other places, change their account information — and have their benefits terminated. This criminal could have been given a sentence of 164 years. But no, five years it is. Why is that?

Then we have a former CEO of a Veteran Service Organization (VSO) who scammed money in federal grant funding that had been given to a nonprofit shelter for homeless veterans. He'd submitted multiple applications for the grant funding, claiming it was for counseling services that nobody ever got, and put over a million dollars in his pocket from the VA and a cool half million from the Department of Labor. His punishment could be only 10 years in prison.

Interestingly enough, there is a man with the exact same name in the same location who once claimed to be an investment counselor and had a radio talk show and who went to prison for scamming banks ...

Is he back? Is this what happens when the prison sentences are too short?

RECIPE

Cheese and Vegetable Tart

INGREDIENTS

Servings: 4

1 sheet of store-bought puff pastry, thawed

5 ounces herb cream cheese (such as Boursin)

6 to 8 asparagus spears

12 cherry tomatoes, halved (red and yellow if possible)

1 egg yolk

2 tablespoons olive oil

Salt and pepper, to taste

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 F. Gently unroll the puff pastry onto a parchment-lined baking sheet.
- 2. Spread the cream cheese evenly over the pastry, leaving a half-inch border around the edges.
- 3. Arrange the asparagus and cherry tomatoes on top of the cheese.
- 4. Brush the edges of the pastry with egg yolk diluted with a little water to achieve a nice golden crust. Drizzle the top with olive oil. Season with salt and pepper to taste.
- 5. Bake for about 20 minutes, until the pastry is golden brown and crisp. Serve warm.







Paws Corner by Sam Mazzotta



Dogs have been performing heroic feats for as long as they've been our companions. But only a few have made it into the history books. Here are a few that you may not have heard of:

Balto and Togo: In January 1925, a diphtheria outbreak threatened Nome, Alaska. To deliver lifesaving serum, teams of sled dogs relayed 500 miles across ice and snow in treacherous weather. Togo led his dog team across the longest, most dangerous part of the relay. Balto, a young and inexperienced husky, sprinted through



fierce winds to reach the town in record time. Their journey is commemorated each year with the Iditarod sled race.

Riley: A Golden Retriever search-and-rescue (SAR) dog who

became the face of SAR dogs in the wake of 9/11. At one point, Riley was sent alone in a basket over a 60-foot chasm to search the wreckage on the other side. He was one of many dogs who searched the World Trade Center rubble to



recover those lost. Riley died in 2010, suffering various health problems, possibly from his time at Ground Zero.

Buddy: In 1928, this German Shepherd became the first Seeing Eye dog in the United States. She (yes, Buddy was a she) was trained by Dorothy Harrison Eustis, who matched Buddy to Frank Morris, a sight-impaired man. Morris championed the use of Seeing Eye dogs, demonstrating Buddy's skill at leading him across busy Manhattan streets.




