

Before making a purchase, take the time to understand the return policy. Ask yourself: can you get a refund, or is it an exchange-only situation? How long is the return period? Is the product a final sale? Do your homework to avoid any unpleasant surprises.

Before extending the invitation, be sure


to consult your partner and other family members. Chances are they'll empathize with your guest and welcome them with open arms.

- A gift in the mail. Send your loved ones a gift through the mail. Get creative with a personalized delivery or consider using a singing telegram service.



Beloved Holiday Traditions from the 1950s-1980s

For many of today's older adults, the holidays are as much about memories as they are about celebrations. Between the 1950s and the 1980s, families across America created traditions that still warm hearts today—and often feel like they came from a simpler, more magical time.

In the 1950s, Christmas often began with the arrival of the Sears "Wish Book." Children spent hours circling toys while parents planned holiday menus filled with Jell-O salads, glazed hams, and homemade fudge. Aluminum Christmas trees—complete with rotating color wheels—became symbols of mid-century modern cheer. Families gathered around black-and-white TV sets to watch "A Christmas Carol," "The Ed Sullivan Show," or the original broadcasts of "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer," which premiered in 1964 and remains a staple to this day.

The 1960s and '70s ushered in new rituals. Tree tinsel shifted from lead strands to the plastic icicles many of us remember untangling every December. Holiday cards filled mailboxes, often tucked with family newsletters typed on the kitchen typewriter. Hanukkah celebrations featured hand-spun dreidels, homemade latkes, and menorahs passed down through generations. Vinyl records from Bing Crosby, Perry Como, and later the Carpenters provided the soundtrack to bustling kitchens and festive living rooms.

By the late 1970s and into the 1980s, the camcorder era arrived. Families began filming Christmas mornings, capturing bed-head children unwrapping Cabbage Patch Kids, Atari consoles, and Easy-Bake Ovens. Holiday décor grew brighter, too—think oversized outdoor lights, ceramic Christmas trees with glowing bulbs, and the steady beep of microwaves warming hot cocoa.

Through all the decades, one thread remained constant: people gathering with loved ones to share food, laughter, faith, and stories. These traditions—from the quiet glow of menorah candles to the bustle of holiday baking—continue to anchor us, reminding us that the best parts of the season often come from the memories we carry forward.



Stay calm to foil scammers

This is a new scam, but then it's what we expect from thieves -- yet another way to steal from us. This one involves our innocent-seeming bank debit card, a scammer and a pair of scissors. Here's how it works:

You'll get a call from someone claiming to be from your bank who says there is fraudulent activity happening on your account, and they need your help. You'll be told that you need to act fast before you lose all your money.

The scammers will tell you to cut up your debit card, but not to cut up the little microchip on the card. Put all the pieces, they'll say, in an envelope and leave it at your door, because a bank "official" is going to rush over to take possession of the evidence. Oh, and there will be one last little detail they'll need -- your bank PIN. By that time, if you're sufficiently rattled, you'll willingly tell them the number.

A scammer will quickly show up at your door to grab the envelope. Armed with that little card chip and your PIN, they can quickly empty your account.

The key is for you to not get rattled, to not let scammers direct your actions.

If you're suspicious about any call, hang up! It's OK (even preferable in this case) to be rude! Call the bank or company on their official number and ask if they were trying to contact you about fraudulent activity on your account.

If your debit card (or any card) expires and the bank or company sends you a replacement, cut up the old one. Be sure to cut through the chip, the magnetic strip on the back and the numbers as well as your name. Divide them up in multiple trash bags to keep the pieces apart.

Remember: Stay calm to defeat the scammers.

Errors in benefits decisions

I'm all in favor of processing veterans benefits claims as fast as possible, but not like this. It appears that a senior VSR (veterans service representative) was authorizing claims decisions at such a fantastic rate that it came to the attention of the VA Office of Inspector General.

In a legitimate decisions process, there are several steps involved in handling a claim, including doing interviews, looking at the issues, checking the evidence and so forth. After all the steps are correctly completed and a decision is made about an award (which includes granting or denying claims), the whole file is sent to a senior VSR to review for accuracy and to authorize.

That senior review, one assumes, involves actually looking at a file, at the data and evidence involved, and at the claims processor's conclusion. This is where the senior VSR skipped steps -- and managed to process 19 times more claims than anyone else in the country. He did this by spending less than five minutes on each file,

where others across the country averaged 21 minutes per file. When queried about that, directors said it was "not physically possible" to do that many claims and have them be correct. During one period, it was learned that the VSR was processing a claim every one to three minutes, meaning that files weren't being opened at all.

OIG reviewed a sample of claims done by that VSR over a six-month period and estimated that 84% of the claims had errors. And errors, when it comes to disability claims, mean granting claims, denying claims and awarding money. In this case, the errors came to an estimated \$2.2 million in wrong payments.

There are too many questions at this point to know how the situation will conclude. But we want to know: Is that VSR still employed? Will denied claims automatically be reviewed? And will overpaid benefits need to be repaid? Veterans deserve better than this.


REPLACE SATURATED AND TRANS FATS

YOUR GOOD HEALTH

DEAR DR. ROACH: I have a "trigger thumb." My thumb no longer bends at the middle joint and hurts. Exercise doesn't seem to work. I tried physical therapy, too, without results. -- A.M.

ANSWER: wwStenosing flexor tenosynovitis, aka trigger finger, is a common issue that I see very frequently in my clinical practice. Symptoms usually start with some "catching" or locking of the fingers while flexing and extending one or more of them. This may progress to discomfort or pain, and it can progress to the point where a finger or thumb is locked in place and needs to be bent by the other hand.

Initial treatment includes rest and anti-inflammatories. Some experts use a splint to reduce the trauma from

repetitive movement in the pulley system of the hand. If conservative treatment isn't effective, most hand experts will try an injection of a steroid into the area of the pulley and tendon. Surgery is an option if two or three injections haven't solved the problem.



Even small amounts of alcohol can impair your judgment. Just because you feel fine doesn't mean you're fit to drive. Although, in most states, the law permits a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of 0.08 percent (0.8 grams of alcohol per liter of blood), this doesn't guarantee your safety behind the wheel.





Festive cupcakes

INGREDIENTS

Makes 12 cupcakes

1 ½ cups flour

1 ½ teaspoons baking powder

½ teaspoon salt

½ cup unsalted butter, softened

1 cup powdered sugar

2 teaspoons vanilla extract, divided

2 eggs, at room temperature

¾ cup milk

2 tablespoons white sugar

2 cups 35% heavy whipping cream

1 cup fresh cranberries

A few sprigs of fresh rosemary

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 F. Line 12 muffin cups with paper liners.
- 2. In a bowl, combine flour, baking powder and salt. Set aside.
- 3. In another bowl, cream the butter and powdered sugar together with electric hand mixer until light and fluffy (about two to three minutes). Add the vanilla. Incorporate the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition.
- 4. Gradually add the dry ingredients and milk to wet mixture, alternating between the two. Pour the mixture into prepared muffin cups.
- 5. Bake for 20 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the center of a cupcake comes out clean. Let cool completely before decorating.
- 6. Meanwhile, pour the white sugar into the cream and beat with an electric hand mixer until stiff peaks form. Top cupcakes with whipped cream, cranberries and rosemary, arranging the rosemary to resemble holly.



How will you spend the approximate \$56 increase that we Social Security beneficiaries will be receiving as of January when the new COLA kicks in.

That 2.8% increase in the average Social Security benefit (\$2,071 for individuals, \$3,208 for couples) won't get us much when compared to increasing costs in grocery stores -- and everywhere else.

It's been a complaint for years. The Cost of Living Adjustment price index (CPI-W) that's used to calculate Social Security increases doesn't apply to us. Instead, we keep saying, they should use the Research Consumer Price Index (R-CPI-E), which is more in line with how seniors over the age of 62 actually spend money.

And then there's the wee problem of Medicare Part B also increasing -- again -- from \$185 this year to \$202 for 2026.

That amount has to be subtracted from the \$56 increase, which means it's actually a \$38 increase in Social Security.

There is, however, a movement afoot in Congress to give us a temporary (six months) increase of \$200 per month from January to July 2026. Called the Social Security Emergency Inflation Relief Act, the proposal is being batted around in Congress at this point. The bill (S.3078) text says it would provide payments to "recipients of social security, supplemental security income, railroad retirement benefits, and veterans disability compensation or pension benefits."

I asked friends in an informal poll, what they would do with that extra \$200 per month should the proposal pass: stick it in savings for an emergency... pay off a medical bill... turn up the thermostat? The responses ran the gamut of possibilities, which says one thing: We need that money.






