


7 things to inspect on your car this summer

- Tires. Make sure your tires are properly inflated and have sufficient tread. Do the same for the spare and make certain you have a jack and lug wrench in the trunk.
- Lights. Ask someone to stand outside your car as you turn on your headlights, brake lights and reverse lights to ensure that they're working.
- Windshield wipers. Make sure your wipers are in good condition and can effectively clear your windows. You should also inspect the sprayer and top off the windshield washer fluid.
- Fluids. Inspect the oil as well as the brake, power steering and transmission fluids. If any of these run out, your car's components may get damaged.
 - Battery. Inspect your battery for signs of corrosion, cracks and leaks. Test it with a battery tester, voltmeter or multimeter. Litchfield Auto will test it for free. Batteries should be tested twice a year and replaced approximately every five years.
- **Undercarriage.** Look under your car for leaks. A fluid leak can cause your steering or braking system to fail.

How hot weather affects your car

Summer driving conditions in Arizona can really put a strain on your vehicle's components. Here's how sun and extreme hot weather affects your car's tires, the engine and the battery.

TIRES The compressed air in your tires expands when exposed to heat, which causes them to inflate. Over-inflated tires will affect the way your car handles and increases the likelihood of getting a flat. Under-inflated tires, however, create more friction with the road and are prone to getting punctured. In summer, check the air pressure in your tires



regularly and take care to closely follow the tire manufacturer's recommendations.

ENGINE Coolant plays an important role in Arizona in the summer. If there isn't enough, your engine can overheat, resulting in premature wear, not to mention leaving you stranded in the heat. Be sure to check coolant levels on a regular basis.

BATTERY When it's hot outside, heat can build up under your hood and cause the fluid in your battery to evaporate. If the fluid level gets too low, this reduces the engine's efficiency and can create issues when starting your car. Hot weather also increases the risk of the battery overheating and can make components such as the plates and separators corrode. To avoid these problems, get your battery inspected before summer.



I'm very sorry to hear that Bliss was traumatized, and I hope your son is able, through medication and training, to improve her confidence.



Here's a Tip

If you drop an egg, sprinkle with salt before you attempt to clean it up. The salt binds the whites, which will not spread, making pickup easier!

You can sharpen scissors by cutting folded aluminum foil into small strips.

The best time of day to water your lawn is the evening. The cooler temperatures allow the water to sink into the soil instead of evaporating with the heat of the day.

Add a small bit of boiling water to a glass of iced tea to clear it up if it is cloudy. You can do this to a pitcher just before serving.

If you're traveling with pets, you know you'll need to bring something for them to drink out of. If you have ice in a container, they can lick the ice to stay hydrated, but it doesn't slosh around or spill easily.

Boiling potatoes? Plants love starch. Let your cooking water cool, then use it to water the plants in your garden.

Dear Alex.

I'm very nervous in writing here as I'm afraid to use the wrong words and cause trouble. My grandchild recently shared that she has "prefered pronouns" and wants to be referred to as "they". I adore her, and I want to be supportive, but I am so confused about what this actually means. Help!

— Bewildered Grandparent

Dear Grandparent,

Thank you for asking this question. They (your grandchild) has obviously chosen you as a safe and supportive person in their life. Your support and acceptance of this request will shape the future interactions they will have with others when sharing pronouns and identity markers moving forward.

The best way to be supportive of your grandchild is to respect and honor their request. Now that you are aware of your grandchild's preferred pronoun, make an effort to use it. If you make a mistake, correct yourself without judgment. It might take some time to get used to using the pronoun they, as it's not a familiar way of referring to your grandchild.

If you want to know why they identify as they,...ask them! This is your chance to learn more about your grandchild and grow closer together. Try to keep an open mind and really hear what they are saying. You may have to change the way you were taught to think. For example, there is a clear distinction between anatomy, gender, pronouns and sexual orientation. While these four identifiers can be linked they don't necessarily need to be.

Try not to pressure your grandchild into sharing their sexual orientation, this is non-related to pronouns or gender identity and it is for them to share with you when they are ready. Remember, gender identity is how someone sees, expresses and understands their own self, and it can evolve and change with the individual as they change! Allow your grandchild to explore this fluidity as they establish their own identity.

The conversation doesn't have to be had in one sitting. Creating an ongoing open dialogue around this topic might open communication and insight across generations. Allowing the both of you to find common ground and respect for each other's beliefs and understandings. You might be surprised by what you learn from them! If you are having difficulty starting this conversation or need some guidance on how to approach them, please feel free to reach out.

Here's How I Saved on Prescription Drugs

The price of prescription drugs has, like everything else, inched up. In some cases, the cost has made a massive, sudden jump, and it comes as a shock when you check out at the pharmacy. But there are ways around this unpleasant surprise.

I recently discovered a way to save a lot of money (\$80 on a 90-day prescription) by doing two things: I changed pharmacies, and I started using GoodRx. Here's how:

Go to the GoodRx website (goodrx.com) and put in your zip code so that all the local pharmacies show up. Enter the name of the medications you take, as well as the dose and number of pills. See what each pharmacy charges using GoodRx. They will vary widely.

Boy, did I get a shock. It took me all of two minutes to call a new pharmacy and ask them to have the prescription transferred.

Then I printed out the GoodRx coupon showing the pharmacy name, the drug and dose, the price and so on. I took that to the pharmacy and voila! Eighty dollars saved.

You might also look into the Kroger Rx Savings Club at Fry's Food. The program is powered by GoodRx and can provide discounts on thousands of prescriptions -- meaning the cost to you could be \$9, \$6, \$3 or even free. The prices on some medications are so low, they often beat insurance copays.

Here are a few other ideas if GoodRx isn't going to work for you:

- -- Ask your doctor if a generic would be just as good, or if another drug would work just as well.
- -- Find out if you qualify for the Extra Help program to pay for your drugs by calling Social Security at 1-800-772-1213, or read the information at www.ssa.gov/pubs/EN-05-10508.pdf.
- -- See if you qualify for the Pharmaceutical Assistance Program. (www.medicare.gov/plan-compare/#/pharmaceutical-assistance-program)
- -- Get a different Medicare drug plan more in line with the drugs you take (www.medicare.gov/plan-compare).

One note: You can't use GoodRx along with a deductible from Medicare or Medicaid, but you can use it instead of those. Beware whether you'll reach your annual deductible if you don't use a Medicare drug plan or if you're in the doughnut hole (cover gap) already.



Food waste: a self-assessment

Despite best intentions, few of us can boast of never wasting food. To improve your food usage over the next few weeks, here are some questions to help you take stock of how much you throw in the trash.

- Have any of your unopened perishables become wilted or moldy?
- Do you have to scrape food like uneaten spaghetti or milk-soaked cereal from your dishes before washing them?
- Do you dispose of food as soon as it passes the expiration date on the packaging?

Once you've evaluated what foods you throw away, you'll have a clearer picture of your household's habits. You may find you're serving oversized portions or buying more perishables than you can eat. With these insights, you'll be able to adjust your practices accordingly.

Before throwing away any food, ask yourself if it can be used in another dish. For example, leftover vegetables

might work in an omelette. Additionally, you can turn a slice of dry bread into breadcrumbs. If you've prepared too much food that can't be frozen, offer the extras to friends or coworkers. You can reduce your waste and make others happy at the same time.

Remember, the expiration date leaves room for flexibility. According to the Food and Safety Inspection Service, this date isn't a guarantee of the safety of a product. Rather, it's an index of the freshness and potential shelf life of foods that haven't been opened. This means that after the date indicated, the food may no longer have the same freshness or nutritional value but may nevertheless be perfectly edible and still taste just fine.

Of course, sure signs of deterioration, like a foul odor or mold, don't lie.

Most VA & DoD Health Records Aren't Accurate

It can be a big problem when you need medical care and the electronic health records sent from one provider to another contain inaccuracies. After sending surveys to 7,387 health care providers in late 2020 asking about their ability to access health care information for both Department of Defense and Department of Veterans Affairs patients and whether that information was accurate, the DoD recently reported that:

- -- 91.2% of DoD patient records were inaccurate or incomplete.
- -- 67.5% of VA patient records were inaccurate or incomplete.
- -- 93.9% said it impacted patient care, including giving an inaccurate or incomplete diagnosis.

The inaccurate or missing information included problems and conditions, lab results, medications and much more.

The VA has known for a long time that they needed to upgrade their 40-year-old computer system and proposed to merge with the DoD's system. That got started in 2018. They would begin with one facility as a test. In 2020, the VA Office of the Inspector General was tasked with finding out one overriding answer: Is it all going well at the test site before they open the system at the 174 VA medical centers, as well as the 1,577 other sites? The answer, in a word, no.

The ill-timed pandemic no doubt kept most workers at home, but they've since made progress. Just recently, the VA brought online its third site with the new system to track and store patient data.

Keep track of your records... and whether they're accurate. Carry a 3x5 card in your wallet listing your drugs and dosages, conditions and surgeries. When you go to a medical appointment at a VA facility, ask for verification that their records are correct.
